

# BLOOMING EASTER PINWHEEL



## You'll need:

greeting card  
(especially ones with flowery designs)

scissors

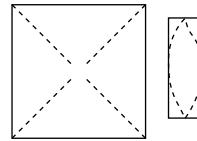
pencil with eraser

straight pin

white glue

## STEP 1

Start with your greeting card and cut a 4" square from its cover. Then from the leftover part of your card, cut a small flower or other design (about the size of a dime). Again from the leftover card, cut two strips 3" long and 1" wide. Set the strips aside for now.

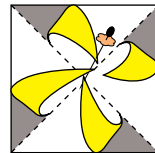


## STEP 2

Stick a straight pin through the center of the dime-sized design and set it aside (with the pin still in it).

## STEP 3

Cut from each corner of the square about 2 1/2" toward its center to make the pinwheel blades.



## STEP 4

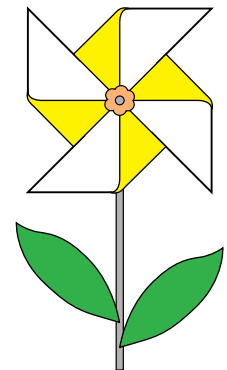
Stick the pin through alternating points on the square. Bring the pin with the first blade toward the center of the square, then skip over the next point on the square to bring up every other blade to stick on the pin.

## STEP 5

With all four blades now stuck on the pin, push the pin through the very center of the square. Pick up the pencil and push the end of the pin through a side of the eraser, attaching your pinwheel to its handle.

## STEP 6

Take your strips and cut to round off the long sides to make leaf shapes. Glue one end of each leaf to the "stem" handle of your blooming pinwheel.
