

Patriotic Folded Fan

What you'll need

- Patriotic printables
(we used 2 pages per fan)
- Scissors
- White glue
- 2 craft sticks
- Binder clips (optional)



How to make it

1. Take 2 printable pages and make 1-inch accordion folds from the top of the pages to the bottoms to form 2 strips.
2. Fold each strip in half and crease.
3. On 1 side of the first accordion strip, glue the 2 halves together, starting from the crease, to form a half circle. Use the binder clips to hold it until it's dry (optional).
4. Then take the second strip and glue it to the first strip. Let dry.
5. Glue a craft stick to each end of the bottom of the second strip, with about half or more of the crafts stick sticking out from the edges of the paper. Let dry.
6. Bring the craft sticks together at their bases to open the fan.
7. You can use a binder clip to hold the craft sticks together to keep your fan either open or closed (optional).



Flat Circle Fan

What you'll need

- 2 pages of the patriotic printables printed on card stock
- Small plate and pencil (optional)
- Scissors
- White glue
- 1 craft stick

How to make it

1. Cut out 2 large circles from the printed card stock. (You can either use the circle designs provided, as shown, or use a small plate to make circles from the other patterned pages.)
 2. Glue the craft stick to the back of 1 circle. Then glue the backs of the 2 circles together.
 3. Trim around the circles if needed.
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Flag

What you'll need

- 2 pages of the patriotic printables printed on card stock
(we used the red-and-white-stripe and the blue stars pages)
- Scissors
- White glue
- ¼-in. wooden dowel

How to make it

1. Cut 2 matching, flag-shaped rectangles from the striped card stock.
2. Cut 2 smaller rectangles from the blue star card stock.
3. Use glue to attach the smaller rectangle to the upper left corner of the first striped rectangle and the upper right corner of the second striped rectangle.
4. Glue the dowel to the back of the first striped rectangle along the left side. Then glue the second rectangle to the back of the first rectangle and the dowel. Trim edges if needed.
