## Starburst Snowflake

Crafter level: Easy Time needed: 10 minutes

## What you'll need

Printout of starburst snowflake template on blank copy paper

- Scissors
- Tape (optional)
- Small hole punch and string (optional)




## How to make it


- 1. Cut around the outside solid lines on your copy paper printout to make a square.
- 2. Fold the square corner to corner twice, creasing along the dotted lines on the outside of the snowflake design, to form a triangle.
- 3. Then, fold the triangle into thirds, following the dotted lines to form an arrow shape. See Diagram 1.
- 4. Now, cut along the solid lines of the snowflake with your scissors, through all layers.

For more fun, make a second snowflake using steps 1-4 and follow these next few steps to make a double-sided snowflake.

- 5. Open them both up and place one snowflake on top of the other, printed sides facing each other.
- 6. Turn the top snowflake about 30° clockwise. (If you imagine a clock face, align both snowflakes, then move the top snowflake from the 12 o'clock position to the 1 o'clock position while keeping the bottom snowflake at 12 o'clock.) The top snowflake's tips should line up to the open area between the tips of the bottom snowflake.
- 7. Press the tips of the top snowflake into the space between the tips of the bottom snowflake on all sides. Voila! Double-sided snowflake—rarely seen in nature!
- 8. Tape it to a window or hang it from a string (optional).
